Aslan is in the beginning stages of collecting information through an anonymous Student Survey. We only have a small sampling, but here are the results so far. Respondents (19); ages (19 – 55).

- 1 100 percent have graduated from high school.
- 2 Two have PhDs.
- Five have Master degrees.
- Two have Bachelor degrees.
- Four have degrees from Technical or Trade School, two are in college, and one has some college.
